

CHSAA Awards Programs



- **First Bank Community All-Stars:** First Bank has dedicated \$6,500.00 to recognize student-participants that make a difference in the classroom and their communities. Each member school nominates a senior student, with a minimum 2.5 GPA and participated in a community service project out-side of their school(projects can be associated with their graduation requirements). Applications sent directly to schools in November. Deadline: TBA per application.
- **IBM Heroes:** IBM/850 KOA/Denver Broncos have teamed with CHSAA to recognize activity/athletic participants, coaches, administrators, officials and volunteers that promote the educational value of interscholastic participation. Nominations must be submitted via school personnel Four to six winners are selected each week during the Denver Bronco season. Winners are recognized on various IBM promotional spots on 850 KOA. All winners will be invited to a reception at INVESCO hosted by IBM and 850 KOA as a “Thank you” for their contribution. (Form located at www.CHSAA.org)
- **Farmer’s Insurance Most Valuable Participants Monthly Award/Scholarship:** Farmer’s has partnered with CHSAA in awarding one-male and one-female student participant (senior in standing, with a minimum 3.4 GPA, and a completed community service project) with a \$1,500.00 (per gender) educational scholarship. The program recognizes 4-6 nominees each month from September to March. Farmer’s Agents are notified and present monthly winners with certificates at their school site at a scheduled school awards or team banquet. CHSAA and a Farmer’s representative will present scholarships to the two-winners at the April Board of Control meeting.
- **Individual Academic All-State:**
First Team Criteria:
 - 1-3.60 or higher cumulative GPA
 - 2-minimum Junior in school
 - 3-must be a letter winner or equivalent in activity nominated
 - 4-must be a participant in a CHSAA sanctioned activity during current seasonHonorable Mention:
 - 1-3.30-3.59 cumulative GPA
 - 2-minimum Junior in standing
 - 3-must be a letter winner or equivalent in activity nominated
 - 4-must be a participant in CHSAA sanctioned activity during current seasonCHSAA provides certificates to each school. Form on website at www.chsaa.org

- **Academic All-State Teams:**

1-Team must have a 3.50 cumulative or higher GPA. Freshman use current GPA to date.

2-All varsity team members that participate on the team/speech-festival-tournament/music-orchestra-band-choir, student council, for more than 75% of season/contest the must be figured in team GPA.

3-Boys and girls teams must be figured separately

4-Only team members GPA's can be used no managers, team attendants, or trainers.

All teams that meet the criteria will be submitted as Academic All-State Teams and posted to the CHSAA website for each season. Forms will be sent to schools directly at the conclusion of each season. There will not be an overall 'Champion'.

- **CHSAA Active Scholar:** The CHSAA and the Colorado Rockies partner to "Rock the Rock Pile" in June. Each school nominates one-boy and one-girl to represent an Active scholar. School representatives are given a certificate and the program pays for their ticket to attend the designated Rockies game. From all the application forms one-boy and one-girl is selected to represent the scholars with an On-Field 'Rockies' ceremony and presentation of their \$1,000.00 scholarship. Schools use their discretion when submitting their nominees. Forms are sent to school in April.
